Notice having been posted, and proof of publication of notice in the *Times Herald Record* having been furnished, a Public Hearing held before the Town Board of the Town of Tuxedo on Tuesday, February 13, 2007 at the Town Hall, One Temple Drive, Tuxedo, New York, was called to order by Supervisor Peter M. Dolan at 7:35 p.m.

The meeting was opened by a pledge of allegiance to the flag.

The purpose of the Public Hearing was to hear comments on a new Schedule of Senior Citizen Tax Exemptions proposed to be adopted, which will increase the maximum income ceiling and revise the sliding scale exemptions in accordance with recent changes in New York State Law, Chapter 298. The proposed exemptions are the maximum permissible under state law and are set forth in the table below.

MAXIMUM ANNUAL INCOME	PERCENTAGE ASSESSED VALUATION EXEMPT FROM TAXATION
\$26,000 or less	50%
\$26,001 to \$26,999	45%
\$27,000 to \$27,999	40%
\$28,000 to \$28,999	35%
\$29,000 to \$29,899	30%
\$29,900 to \$30,799	25%
\$30,800 to \$31,699	20%
\$31,700 to \$32,599	15%
\$32,600 to \$33,499	10%
\$33,500 to \$34,400	5%
