Agenda Item #2a- RESOLUTION OF SEQR NEGATIVE DECLARATION AND APPROVAL OF PURCHASE OF REAL PROPERTY / 209 ROUTE 17

WHEREAS: The Town Board has considered and evaluated the potential environmental impacts of the purchase by the Town of real property located at 209 State Route 17 (Village Tax Map No. 212-2-40). The Town Board, acting pursuant to the State Environmental Quality Review Act (SEQR) and the SEQR Regulations, has reviewed and evaluated the information and documents pertaining to the Board's SEQR review and the Board's approval to purchase the real property. The purchase price of \$550,000.00 is equal to or less than fair market value.

THEREFORE, IT IS RESOLVED as follows:

Description of Action:

Purchase for municipal purposes of vacant commercially zoned property containing 0.33 +/- acres

Reasons Supporting This Determination:

In making this SEQR determination, the Board has considered the criteria set forth in §617.7 (c) of the SEQR Regulations and has evaluated relevant areas of potential environmental concern to determine whether this action may have a significant adverse impact on the environment. The Board has reviewed the Short Environmental Assessment Form Part1 and recommended Part 2 prepared by the Town's attorney, and all Board members are familiar with the property and the vicinity. After review, evaluation and consideration, there is no evidence of any potential significant adverse impacts that may be caused by the purchase of this real property.

Although the Board's intent is to construct a parking lot on the property, this property is purchased for any municipal purpose. Additional parking is greatly needed in this area and a parking lot is fully consistent with the surrounding uses and the community character. The Board is aware that SEQR requires that an entire action be considered for purposes of environmental review, and that considering only a part or segment of an action for the purpose of avoiding environmental review of the entire action is contrary to the intent of SEQR. The Board is also aware that SEQR allows segmented review when warranted if the lead agency clearly states the supporting reasons and demonstrates that such review is clearly no less protective of the environment. Formal plans and specifications for the construction of a parking lot have not been prepared, and the Board will evaluate the potential environmental impacts of construction and use of a parking lot after the preparation of plans and specifications. In addition, approval of the purchase of the property does not preclude any mitigation measures that could be implemented as related to the actual construction and use of the property as a parking lot. Therefore, the Board's SEQR review and determination on the potential environmental impacts of the purchase alone is no less protective of the environment.

The EAF Mapper on the NYSDEC website indicates that this property contains or is substantially contiguous to a building, archeological site or district which is listed or eligible for listing on the National or State Register of Historic Places, and that the property is located in or adjacent to an area designated as sensitive for archeological sites on the State archeological site inventory. The EAF Mapper also indicates that the property or adjoining lands contain regulated wetlands or other waterbodies and that the property contains species, or associated habitats, of the northern long-eared bat and timber rattlesnake, which are listed as threatened or endangered species. The Board does not believe that these indications on the EAF Mapper are accurate; however, these potential environmental issues will be addressed by the Board as part of its SEQR review prior to actual construction and use of the property.

IT IS FURTHER RESOLVED, for the reasons set forth above, that the Board finds and determines that the proposed purchase of the real property will not have any significant adverse impact on the environment. Accordingly, this SEQR Negative Declaration is hereby issued and shall be filed in accordance with the SEQR Regulations.

This Negative Declaration was prepared in accordance with Article 8 of the state Environmental Conservation Law.

IT IS FURTHER RESOLVED that this Board approves the purchase of the real property located 209 State Route 17 (Village Tax Map No. 212-2-40) in the amount of \$550,000.00, approves the contract of sale, subject to final review/approval by the Town's attorney; and authorizes the Town Supervisor or Deputy Supervisor to execute all necessary documents.

<u>Agenda Item #2(b) – Bond Resolution Authorizing the Acquisition of Land for the</u> estimated cost of \$560,000.00

BOND RESOLUTION OF THE TOWN OF TUXEDO, ADOPTED MARCH 11, 2024, AUTHORIZING THE ACQUISITION OF LAND, STATING THAT THE ESTIMATED MAXIMUM COST THEREOF IS \$560,000.00, APPROPRIATING SAID AMOUNT THEREFOR AND AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF \$560,000.00 SERIAL BONDS TO FINANCE SAID APPROPRIATION

WHEREAS, all conditions precedent to the financing of the capital project hereinafter described, including compliance with the provisions of the State Environmental Quality Review Act, have been performed; and

WHEREAS, it is now desired to authorize the financing of such capital project;

NOW THEREFORE,

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE TOWN BOARD OF THE TOWN OF TUXEDO IN THE COUNTY OF ORANGE, NEW YORK, (by the favorable vote of not less than two-thirds of all the members of said Board) AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. The Town is hereby authorized to acquire land, specifically 209 Route 17, Tuxedo, New York, tax map section 212, block 2, lot 40, for municipal purposes. The estimated maximum cost of said specific object or purpose, including preliminary costs, legal documents and costs incidental hereto and the financing thereof, is \$560,000.00 and the said amount is hereby appropriated therefor. The plan of financing is the issuance of \$560,000.00 serial bonds to finance said appropriation and the levy of a tax on all the taxable real property within the Town to pay the principal of said bonds and interest thereon as the same shall become due and payable.

Section 2. Serial bonds in the principal amount of \$560,000.00 are hereby authorized to be issued pursuant to the Local Finance Law, constituting Chapter 33-a of the Consolidated Laws of the State of New York (herein called "Law"), to finance said appropriation.

Section 3. The following additional matters are hereby determined and stated:

a) The period of probable usefulness applicable to the purpose for which said serial bonds herein authorized are to be issued, within the limitations of Section 11.00a.21 of the Law, is thirty (30) years.

b) The proposed maturity of the bonds authorized by this resolution will exceed five (5)

years.

c) The proceeds of the bonds herein authorized and any bond anticipation notes issued in anticipation of said bonds may be applied to reimburse the Town for expenditures made after the effective date of this resolution for the purpose for which said bonds are authorized. The foregoing statement of intent with respect to reimbursement is made in conformity with Treasury Regulation Section 1.150-2 of the United States Treasury Department.

Section 4. The bonds authorized by this resolution and any bond anticipation notes in anticipation of the sale of said bonds, shall contain the recital of validity prescribed by Sec. 52.00 of the Law and said bonds and any notes issued in anticipation of such bonds, shall be general obligations of the Town, payable as to both principal and interest by a general tax upon all the taxable real property within the Town without limitation of rate or amount. The faith and credit of the Town are hereby irrevocably

pledged to the punctual payment of the principal of and interest of said bonds and any notes issued in anticipation of said bonds, and provisions shall be made annually in the budget of the Town by appropriation for (a) the amortization and redemption of the bonds and notes to mature in each year and (b) the payment of interest to be due and payable in each year.

Section 5. Subject to the provisions of this resolution and of the Law and pursuant to the provisions of Sec. 21.00 relative to the authorization of the issuance of bonds with substantially level or declining annual debt service, and of Sec. 30.00 relative to the authorization of the issuance of bond anticipation notes and of Sec. 50.00 and Sec. 56.00 to 60.00 and 168.00 of the Law, the powers and duties of the Town Board relative to authorizing bond anticipation notes and prescribing the terms, form and contents as to the sale and issuance of the bonds herein authorized and of any bond anticipation notes issued in anticipation of said bonds, and the renewals of said bond anticipation notes, and relative to providing for substantially level or declining annual debt service, are hereby delegated to the Town Supervisor, the chief fiscal officer of the Town.

Section 6. The validity of the bonds authorized by this resolution and of any notes issued in anticipation of said bonds, may be contested only if:

 such obligations are authorized for an object or purpose of which the Town is not authorized to expend money, or

(b) the provisions of the law which should be complied with at the date of the publication of such resolution are not substantially complied with, and an action, suit or proceeding contesting such validity is commenced within twenty days after the date of such publication or

(c) such obligations are authorized in violation of the provisions of the constitution.

Section 7. This resolution is subject to permissive referendum.

Section 8. The object or purpose described in Section 1 hereof has been determined to be an Unlisted Action pursuant to the regulations of the New York State Department of Environmental Conservation promulgated pursuant to the State Environmental Quality Review Act, with respect to which said Town Board has made a "Negative Declaration."
