## Design Guidelines and Requirements

### Introduction

These Design Guidelines establish the standards of the Tuxedo Farms development. They provide the minimum requirements for exterior facades, exterior landscaping, construction details, quality of products to be utilized, and will ensure a cohesive community from “The Commons”, its mixed-use center, which will then feather out to the surrounding neighborhoods. The Design Guidelines and SmartCode together will ensure that the unique vision for Tuxedo Farms is both achieved and maintained through its development.



## Architectural Style Guidelines

This section is to create the basis for the architectural style of the community and its neighborhoods. The town center of the community is “The Commons” that will have a mix of Commercial, multi-family and mixed-use buildings in a modern Tudor styling and feather out transitioning through the Residential Townhouse neighborhoods and into the Single-Family neighborhoods with a more traditional design as generally depicted in the images shown below. Portions of “Upland Park” will have multi-family buildings and will follow the design intent of “The Commons”. For purposes of the Project, the Planning Board shall serve as the Architectural Review Board unless the Town creates a separate ARB.



### **1. Modern Tudor Style**

The characteristic exterior features of the Modern Tudor style designed for “The Commons” are: the use of half-timber work with Stucco (EIFS/ Hardy Panel) infill; large groups of rectangular windows; complex steep roofs with intersecting front-facing gables, chimney treatments; and much brickwork, frequently in patterns.

### **2. Tudor Elements added for Transitioning**

This style will create a feathering from the historic town “The Commons” into the outlying neighborhoods.

The use of steeper gables; vertical siding materials; and brick/stonework to accent the base of the buildings.



### **3. Additional Building Styles**

These images are for the presentation of general elevation and home design style examples and all homes remain subject to and are superseded by the requirements of the Design Guidelines







Within each neighborhood of Tuxedo Farms, the home styles mentioned above shall be internally consistent, so they are complementary. However, each separate Tuxedo Farms neighborhood is permitted to have a home style that varies from other Tuxedo Farms neighborhoods

## **Architectural Principles and Guidelines**

While the style guidelines introduced in the previous pages provide guidance as to the range of architectural expression appropriate at Tuxedo Farms, the following set of requirements are intended to illustrate basic principles of form, composition, materials and detail.

### **1. Windows/ Doors**

- a. Windows are permitted to be single-hung or casement vinyl windows with integral grills between glass (*if provided*) to match style of home.
- b. Windows and doors located on the front façade of the structure shall include trim and/or shutters (*if provided*) to match front façade.
- c. Windows and doors located on the sides and rear of the structure are permitted to include a minimum 3 ½" 'J' channel surround, *except* at corner lots where such windows and doors shall match the application of the front façade.



### *1.1 'J' Channel Surround*

- d. Windows shall use vertical proportions generally. Horizontal groups of windows shall be composed of vertically proportioned panes.



*1.2 Depicts permitted window types, use of trim/ shutters, and vertically proportioned panes*

## **2. Garage Doors**

- a. All front facing garage doors shall have transom lights in the topmost bay of the door, with integral grills between glass. Rear/ alley loaded or side-entry garage doors are permitted to be raised panel.
- b. Single 16-foot-wide doors are permitted and shall not appear as a single door, but shall mimic 2-individual garage doors with style or hardware of contrasting color, *except* rear/ alley loaded or side-entry garage doors which are permitted to be raised panel.
- c. Color selection of garage doors should be complementary to the exterior color packages, refer to [\*\*Table 1 Exterior Color Packages\*\*](#) below.



*2.1 Single car garage doors with topmost bay of the door with glass panes and contrasting hardware*




*2.2 Single, 16-foot-wide garage door to mimic 2-individual doors with style and hardware*

### **3. Porches**

- a. Materials for stoops, porches, decks, and steps are outlined in [\*\*Table 2 Architectural Guidelines Material Chart\*\*](#).
- b. Uncovered Entry Porches shall be a minimum of 4'-0" deep
- c. Covered Porches shall be a minimum of 5'-0" deep
- d. Columns (*if provided*) shall not be less than 6-inches square with a cap and a base.
- e. Railings are required where finished grade is more than 30-inches below porch level. See [\*\*Table 2 Architectural Guidelines Material Chart\*\*](#) for approved materials.
- f. Porches and foundation piers typically have lattice or panels as infill between piers.

#### 4. Roofs



4.0 Roof Pitch Diagram

##### 4.1 Sloped Roofs

- a. Front gabled roofs (*if provided*) shall have a minimum roof pitch of 6:12 for all neighborhoods except “The Commons”.
- b. Primary roof structure and side gabled roofs shall have a minimum roof pitch of 4:12
- c. Primary roof structure and side gabled roofs within “The Commons” shall have a minimum roof pitch of 9:12
- d. Secondary roofs may vary in pitch and shall have a minimum roof pitch of 3:12
- e. Roof overhangs on front facades and gables shall be 6” minimum. Side and rear gable overhangs are permitted to be flush condition, *except* at corner lots where such side or rear gables shall have a minimum of a 6” overhang

- f. Roof Material color shall be complementary to exterior color packages, see [\*\*Table 1 Exterior Color Packages\*\*](#) below.
- g. Roof materials permitted but not limited to (see [\*\*Table 2 Architectural Guidelines Material Chart\*\*](#) below for additional information):
  - i. Asphalt roof shingles
  - ii. Standing seam metal roofs
  - iii. Simulated slate

#### **4.2 Flat Roofs**

- a. Flat roofs are permitted for multi-family, commercial, mixed-use, civic, and amenity buildings and shall be hidden from view behind parapets.

#### **5. Gutters and Downspouts**

- a. Homes are permitted to have aluminum "K" (Ogee) gutters and downspouts.

#### **6. Fireplaces/ Chimneys**

- a. Direct-vent fireplaces with vinyl siding surround and shed roofs are permitted on the side and rear facades, *except* at corner lots where they are not permitted on the side façade facing the public right-of way. Such direct vent fireplaces are not permitted in "The Commons".
- b. Full height chimneys are permitted in all neighborhoods on any façade and shall be cladded in a masonry type material including brick and/or stone veneer.

## **7. Floor Heights**

### **a. Residential**

- i. Main living level of all residential homes shall have a minimum 9-foot ceiling height.
- ii. Lower or upper floors, other than the main living level, shall have a minimum 8-foot ceiling height.

### **b. Mixed-Use**

- i. Main level of all Mixed-Use buildings to be a minimum 10-foot ceiling height.
- ii. Upper floors, other than the main level, shall have a minimum of 8-foot ceiling height.

## **8. Exterior Lighting**

- a. All Lighting within the Tuxedo Farms Development shall be in accordance with the lighting standards set forth in the SmartCode, and all light fixtures shall be materially consistent with the design intent of these Architectural Style Guidelines.

## **9. Materials and Colors**


- a. Refer to *Table 1 Exterior Color Packages*
- b. Refer to *Table 2 Architectural Guidelines Material Chart* for all material specifications
- c. Wall cladding permitted (Any material substitutions permitted by Planning Board shall be equal or better than approved building materials):
  - i. Horizontal vinyl siding with a minimum 4-inch exposure and a maximum 8-inch exposure
  - ii. Vinyl shake siding
  - iii. Vinyl board and batten siding (vertical siding)
  - iv. Hardie board (fiber cement) siding

- v. Brick
  - vi. Stone veneer
  - vii. Stucco (EIFS/ Hardy Panel)
  - viii. Clapboard
- d. Masonry Veneer
- i. Manufactured stone or brick veneer is permitted.
  - ii. Masonry veneer should not be on a single-face and shall return to nearest offset wall
  - iii. Masonry veneer shall return a minimum of 2-foot on side elevations
  - iv. In the case of a side-entry, masonry veneer (*if provided*) shall return to the entry door
  - v. Masonry veneer shall not be used above lighter materials. All masonry veneer shall extend to grade, or with minimum clearances to grade as required by manufacturers specifications.
- e. Any concrete exposure at a building foundation that exceeds 3 feet shall be adequately screened by landscaping and/or a deck (if rear yard).
- f. Any home outside of “The Commons” that is directly visible at a first-floor elevation or within 300 feet of the Commons in any direction shall have colors or textures that complement the color or textures of “The Commons” buildings

All outlined material and color selections in this document are subject to change based on availability and market conditions. Any material substitutions will be equal or better than approved building materials.

## **Building Massing & Materials**

This section is provided to supply the building specific requirements for Tuxedo Farms.

### **1. Townhomes/Stacked Townhomes**

#### **a. Building Articulation**

- i. Horizontal offsets of not less than 2-feet at the front façade of the building may be provided at every 3<sup>rd</sup> unit to break-up the overall length of building
- ii. Building roof line is encouraged to have breaks at every 3<sup>rd</sup> unit to break-up the overall length of the roof such as a gable or other type treatment

#### **b. Building Materials**

- i. Townhome buildings shall be permitted to be of the same materials, style and color palettes. Color palettes may change per neighborhood or market conditions.
- ii. See **Table 1 Exterior Color Packages**.
- iii. Where masonry is used, 3-story stacked townhomes and 3-story townhomes shall have a masonry return on the side façade up to the second-floor line at a minimum and a minimum 25% of the depth of the side façade

### **2. Commercial/ Mixed-Use Residential and Multi-Family Buildings**

#### **a. Building Articulation**

- i. Facades of the building visible from the street shall have vertical articulation at a minimum of every 60-feet with either:
  1. A horizontal building offset of at least 1-foot
  2. Bay windows or stacked balconies that encompass at least 2-levels of the building.
- ii. Building roof line is permitted to be on a single plain but shall have visual articulation at a minimum of every 60-feet either with:

1. Turned gabled roofs
2. Dormers
3. Architectural decorative treatment

**b. Building Materials**

- i. Buildings shall be permitted to be of the same materials, style and color palettes. Color palettes may change per neighborhood or market conditions.
- ii. See ***Table 1.1 “The Commons” Exterior Color Packages.***
- iii. A clear definitive masonry base of the building shall be provided in either brick, stone, or Stucco (EIFS/ Hardy Panel).

## **Waivers**

1. The Planning Board is hereby authorized during its site plan and/or subdivision review (unless the Town creates a separate ARB, in which case the ARB shall have the waiver authority provided in this section during its review) to grant a Waiver or Waivers to the Architectural Guidelines on a case by case basis provided the Planning Board in its capacity as Architectural Review Board finds justification for the grant of such Waiver on the following specific grounds:
  - a. the Waiver is the result of a design condition that renders it impracticable to achieve strict compliance with the Architectural Design Guidelines within the development area;
  - b. grant of the Waiver will not cause an adverse environmental impact;
  - c. grant of the Waiver will not create any nuisance or unsafe condition; and
  - d. grant of the Waiver is consistent with the design intent of the Preliminary Plan and Special Permit.


## Look-alike Standards, Single-Family Detached Lots

This section is to provide homes in the single-family neighborhoods with individual characteristics within a specific streetscape.

### 1. Proximity of similar facades for Single-Family lots

- Refer to location lot graphic and definitions below:

The triangle region for your home, "X," includes locations with two levels of classification; **A** & **B**.



#### **A LOCATION LOTS (RELATIVE TO X):**

- Adjacent homesites
- Homesite directly across the street. If you were to draw a line perpendicular across the street from any point on the front lot lines of **X**, any homesite that these lines hit or fall within on either side of the street is considered to be an **A** location.

#### **B LOCATION LOTS (RELATIVE TO X):**

- Homesites on the same side of the street two homesites away from homesite **X**. If the adjacent homesite to **X** is a corner homesite, the homesite next to the corner and the homesite across the street from the corner homesite are not considered **B** locations since there is a road separating the homesites that would normally be considered **B** locations.
- Any homesite immediately adjacent to the **A** location homesites across the street, so long as the homesite is on the same street as the adjacent **A** location lot across the street.
- If homesite **X** is a corner homesite on the 4-way intersection, the homesite catty corner across the intersection is a **B** location homesite.

#### **GENERAL RULES FOR HOME X:**

- Lot **X** cannot be the same or what is considered to be a similar vinyl siding color to homesites considered **A**.

#### **GENERAL RULES FOR HOME A:**

- Cannot be the same elevation.
- Cannot be the same vinyl siding color.

#### **GENERAL RULES FOR HOME B:**

- Cannot have the same vinyl siding color

# Landscape Guidelines

## Introduction

These Landscape Guidelines establish the minimum standards for the landscape treatment of external spaces within the Tuxedo Farms Development. They provide the minimum requirements for the landscaping of common areas, neighborhoods and homesites throughout the development. The overall design intent of these Landscape Guidelines is the provision of landscapes which complement the natural landscapes within the development. Detailed landscape plans shall be provided to the Planning Board for review and approval as part of the site plan review process.

### **1. General Planting Guidelines**

- a. All plant materials to be non-invasive materials. Plant materials shall be native to the Tuxedo area such that there is an opportunity to provide pollinator pathways within Tuxedo Farms. See *Table 3 Representative Sample Plant List*
- b. To the extent that there is no maximum impervious coverage requirement or restriction, any area outside of driveways, sidewalks and service walks, shall be provided as lawn or landscaped.
- c. Visual surveillance of common open space, parking areas or dwelling entries and building facades facing streets should not be obscured through landscaping.
- d. Where practicable, preserve and enhance existing site vegetation.
- e. Supplement new forest edge and meadow edge areas to encourage regrowth and protect wildlife.
- f. Use of plant material to respond to a variety of solar aspects, shading, drainage and soil conditions. See *Table 3 Representative Sample Plant List*
- g. Plant materials shall be selected and located to avoid conflicts with utilities.

- h. Deciduous trees to be planted no closer than 3' on center from the face of curb or sidewalk. Evergreen trees to be planted no closer than 6' to the face of curb or sidewalk.
- i. Existing trees and vegetation shall count towards achieving the required planting guidelines provided those existing trees and vegetation are in locations otherwise required to be planted.
- j. Plant materials shall be compatible with local environment and vegetation, and with sufficient species variety to minimize the spread of disease or infestation.

See ***Table 3 Representative Sample Plant List***

- k. Each home type will have 2-yard sections or realms for planting guidelines, the Front Realm being that yard area that is 45' from the back of curb adjacent to the street (in the event of no curb then from the edge of pavements); and the Rear Realm being that balance of the yard from the end of the Front Realm to the rear yard lot line.
- l. Plant material shall include the following categories: Shade Tree is a tree that at time of maturity will be approximately 50' tall; Understory Tree is a tree that at the time of maturity will be approximately 20' tall; Large Shrub shall have a mature width of approximately 5'; Foundation Plantings shall be a mix of small shrubs, perennials and grasses. Landscaping shall be permitted to have a variety of configurations based on building footprints, location of porch, deck, patio, driveway, sidewalks, service walks and environmental constraints.

## **2. Home Specific Guidelines**

- a. Townhomes (of various widths), Rear Garage Stacked Townhomes and Front Garage Stacked Townhomes
  - i. Front Realm – one Shade Tree per building, a minimum of 6FT in height and 2.5 inch in caliper, located to the side of the building, two Large Shrubs per Townhome, and two Large Shrubs per Rear and Front Stacked Townhome buildings, with supplemental Foundation Plantings added.

- ii. Rear Realm – one Understory Tree per 2 Townhomes units and two Front Garage Stacked Townhome units, Foundation Plantings in between each Townhome units and each Front Garage Stacked Townhome unit and to one side of each such buildings, with none proposed for Rear Garage Stacked Townhome units due to rear yard being dedication to fully paved parking, drive area and driveway surface area.
- b. Single Family (market rate and age restricted) and Duplex (age restricted)
  - iii. Front Realm – one Shade Tree or two Understory Trees per lot, Foundation Plantings including two Large Shrubs per Single Family lot, and Duplex lots with Foundation Plantings and one Large Shrub per lot.
  - iv. Rear Realm – one Shade Tree or two Understory Trees per lot, seven Large Shrubs per Single Family lot, and six Large Shrubs per Duplex lot.
  - v. In both the Front and Rear Realm, the homeowner will be permitted to add additional landscaping subject to receipt of applicable homeowner association approval. Table 3 shall be an exhibit to the homeowner association governing documents, to provide guidance as to such landscaping material.
- c. Single Family Farm lots
  - vi. Front Realm – two Shade Trees or three Understory Trees per lot, Foundation Plantings including four Large Shrubs per lot with Foundation Plantings
  - vii. Rear Realm – one Shade Tree or three Understory Trees per lot, seven Large Shrubs per Single Family lot.
  - viii. In both the Front and Rear Realm, the homeowner will be permitted to add additional landscaping subject to receipt of applicable homeowner association approval. Table 3 shall be an

exhibit to the homeowner association governing documents, to provide guidance as to such landscaping material.

### **3. Stormwater Management and Biofiltration Swales**

- a. All areas seeded with “wet meadow seed mix” or equivalent
- b. Two Shade Trees or Understory Trees per 1,000 square feet
- c. Seven Large Shrubs per 1,000 square feet.
- d. These stormwater and biofiltration swale planting guidelines are to be incorporated into any SWPPP, stormwater plans and stormwater maintenance manual.

## **Waivers**

2. The Planning Board is hereby authorized during its site plan and/or subdivision review to grant a Waiver or Waivers to the Landscape Guidelines on a case by case basis provided the Planning Board finds justification for the grant of such Waiver on the following specific grounds:
  - a. the Waiver is the result of a site condition that renders it impracticable to achieve strict compliance with the Landscape Design Guidelines within the development area;
  - b. grant of the Waiver will not cause an adverse environmental impact;
  - c. grant of the Waiver will not create any nuisance or unsafe condition; and
  - d. grant of the Waiver is consistent with the design intent of the Preliminary Plan and Special Permit.
