Supervisor English acknowledges he is in receipt of the January monthly reports from the following Departments;

Monthly Reports

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Police Chief Abbott said the department had received 2 letters from the Town of Ramapo regarding 3 of our Police Officers. Officer Gerard Shiloh and Officer William Hall were at the scene of the train/truck accident by Daters Crossing in Sloatsburg. They both assisted in keeping passengers calm and transporting them to Tuxedo and Harriman Train Stations.

A call had come in of a suicidal person in Sloatsburg; Detective Stefan Christian was in the area and responded. He assisted the Ramapo Police in handling the situation.

Thank you to our Police Officers for their hard work.

TOWN SUPERVISOR/TOWN BOARD UPDATE:

Supervisor English has met with the sewer plant operator. There are deadlines that have to be met from the DEC, A schedule needs to be presented to fix the current plant. An additional schedule must be presented stating when the town will put the new sewer plant online by March 31st.

There will be a meeting to meet with the residents and businesses that use the plant to go over detail n discuss issues in the near future.

Mr. Pollock with the DEC will meet with the Supervisor to review the consent order that is currently in place for the highway site,

Supervisor English wants to figure out how to resolve the remaining problems as he feels the property has been a liability to the Town.

Councilmember May is researching possible monies that may be available to help to pay for the remaining remediation.

Deputy Supervisor Lindsay stated there is a meeting of the Economic Development Committees and the Town Board on February 12th at 6:30pm. The committee will update the Board on the things that they been working on and discuss how they can work together to move their ideas into action.

PUBLIC COMMENTS ON AGENDA ITEMS:

John McNamara, (resident) wondered why the conversations regarding the new sewer plant were described as being complicated when Highway Superintendent Dollbaum said it is only a question of connecting the pipe.

Supervisor English stated that figuring out the user fees is the complicated part; Related is not obligated to pay the user fees until they have a certificate of occupancy on their project. Councilmember Reichgott said that even if the existing plant was fixed up it old not meet the current standards for a sewage treatment plant.

John McNamara questioned why the mulch pile remediation had not cost the Town any money to clean it up before why will it cost money now? Supervisor English answered that all the problems were still there. Mary Graetzer (resident) said that the mulch pile and attendant debris has gone down a lot.

Supervisor English noted the site monitor had retired but we had a loose agreement with him. We need to hire a new monitor and write a new agreement.

Councilmember McMillen said that the Town hired someone to do an aerial survey of the land to find out exactly how much more has to be done. The Town was also required to dig test holes on the site and they did find some contamination at the bottom of the holes. He feels they need to discuss a new method of remediation.

John Ruel, Planning Board Member said he was told that to run a new sewer plant at less than capacity would be cost prohibitive. He was told this as the problem however they found a way to run it at less than full cost but will still be expensive. Mr. Ruel also made a point that the Warwick Brook was always loaded with Trout fish and now there are none. He asked if anyone knew if there had been any testing on this. No one knew the answer.

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WHEREAS, pursuant to GML § 760, the Town Board met within thirty days (August 12, 2019) after certification of the favorable vote to discuss the next steps in the consolidation process; and

WHEREAS, the Secretary of State issued a certificate of incorporation for the Village of Tuxedo on December 23, 2019; and

WHEREAS, within 180 days after the initial August 12 meeting, the Town Board must prepare a finalized Consolidation Plan based off of the elector-initiated Consolidation Plan and approve it by resolution for public review and comment; and

WHEREAS, since that date, the Town Board has met, discussed, and reviewed the electorinitiated Consolidation Plan to determine if any additions, changes, or other edits should be incorporated;

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that, pursuant to Article 17-A of the GML, the Town Board hereby adopts its version of the Final Consolidation Plan based upon those discussions, a copy of which is available for public inspection in the office of the Town Clerk; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Town of Tuxedo must call for a mandatory public hearing on the proposed Final Consolidation Plan, which may not be held less than 35 or more than 90 days after the date of this resolution:

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Board hold a public hearing on the Final Consolidation Plan at the Town of Tuxedo Town Hall, 1 Temple Drive, Tuxedo, New York 10987, in the Town of Tuxedo, Tuxedo, New York at 7:00 PM P.M. on March 23, 2020; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Clerk display or cause to be displayed a copy of the proposed Consolidation Plan, along with a descriptive summary thereof, on the Town website and in the office of the Town Clerk; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Clerk publish or cause to be published a descriptive summary of the proposed elector initiated consolidation plan and a reference to the public place(s) where a copy thereof may be examined, at least once per week for four successive weeks, in the official newspaper of the Town of Tuxedo: and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Clerk publish or cause to be published a public notice in the official newspaper of the Town of Tuxedo of said public hearing at least ten (10) days prior thereto. Vote: Resolution carried by a vote of 5 to 0.
