Supervisor English acknowledged receiving reports for the month of June from the Police Department, Justice Department and the Town Clerk,

Town Supervisor / Town Board update:

The Supervisor said the Town is still under a consent order from the DEC at the Highway site. This consent order has been in place for at least 10 years. The Town can potentially get fined \$3,000.00 a day for non-compliance. The Supervisor stated that the Town set aside \$250,000. Larry Ricci has been assigned as the new site monitor.

Highway Superintendent Dollhaum has rented equipment and has dedicated 2 of his employees to star the screening operation. This process will be done for the next 3 or 4 months. They will be sifting the dirt pile separating out all contaminants. He stated that no contaminated soil will leave the property.

Deputy Supervisor Lindsay gave a hats off to the Highway Department; she had visited the site and stated what a huge job this is. Supervisor English also gave a hats off to the Team.

The Supervisor stated the next big item is the sewer plant. The new plant needs to be brought online. Councilmember Reichgott said existing plant is basically on its "last legs" since it is at least 100 years old. It does not meet with modern standards.

Supervisor English stated he will be meeting on July 15th with representatives from Related to discuss the process. He is hoping to get an update on their plans for the Tuxedo Farms property.

Supervisor English stated that RFP's have been sent out for the Town Garbage collection and for a cleaning company that will be going to the Town Hall, Police Department, the Train Station, Murphy Field in Eagle Valley and the Highway Department.

Supervisor English said that we are now in Phase 4 of the Covid remediation, and are getting ready to open the Town Hall to the public. He commented how the staff had responded well and that no complaints have been received in regards to residents trying to do business.

Councilmember McMillen said he negotiated a wireless upgrade with Optimum for the Town Hall.

Deputy Supervisor Lindsay spoke about the Census saying how important it is for everyone to be counted, this way the Town would be eligible to receive all the money they can. The current deadline is mid-August. She went on to say

At a meeting of the Town Board of the Town of Tuxedo, County of Orange, State of New York, held at Town Hall in said Town on the 13th day of July, 2020;

WHEREAS, HUME R. STEYER, AS EXECUTOR and THE ESTATE OF H. ALEXANDER SALM, has commenced a tax certiorari proceeding against the Town of Tuxedo in the Supreme Court of the State of New York, County of Orange for the 2019-20 tax assessment year bearing Orange County Index # EF005314-2019;

WHEREAS, it appears from the recommendation of the Town Assessor and Kara J. Cavallo, Esq., of Jacobowitz and Gubits, counsel for the Town of Tuxedo in the aforesaid proceedings, upon a thorough investigation of the claims that further proceedings and litigation by the Town would involve considerable expense with the attendant uncertainty of the outcome and that the settlement of the above matter as more fully set forth below is reasonable and in the best interests of the Town; and

WHEREAS, HUME R. STEYER, AS EXECUTOR and THE ESTATE OF H. ALEXANDER SALM, is willing to settle these proceedings without interest, costs or disbursement, in the following manner;

- (1) That the proceeding for the 2019-20 tax year be compromised and settled by the assessment being reduced from \$500,000 to a total assessment of \$244,112 for tax map no. 107-1-14.2;
- (2) That the proceeding for the 2019-20 tax year be compromised and settled by the assessment being increased from \$14,800 to a total assessment of \$78,612 for tax map no. 107-1-13:
- (3) That the proceeding for the 2019-20 tax year be compromised and settled by the assessment being reduced from \$3,800 to a total assessment of \$2,482 for tax map no. 107-1-14.1;
- (4) That the proceeding for the 2019-20 tax year be compromised and settled by the assessment being increased from \$4,500 to a total assessment of \$4,965 for tax map no. 107-1-12 22:
- (5) That petitioner(s) real property taxes for the 2019-20 School taxes and the 2020 County and Town taxes be adjusted accordingly and that petitioner(s) be reimbursed for any overpayment without interest, if paid within sixty (60) days of notice of entry, or be credited with the corresponding decrease in taxes, as the case may be;
